

Dear Member,

NUCA is pleased to announce the settlement of a class action lawsuit challenging AT&T's bills for repairing damage from cable cuts. AT&T has agreed to pay up to \$15 million in cash and change its future billing practices. The settlement, which is subject to approval by a federal court in Florida, is valued at more than \$38 million.

If you paid AT&T for a cable cut from July 1, 2008 through May 1, 2016, you likely received in the mail recently a notice about the settlement and are eligible to receive a cash payment. The size of the payment depends on the number and amount of the bills you paid to AT&T and could range from as little as \$10 to more than \$5000. The average payment exceeds \$120 and some will receive more than \$20,000. To receive a payment, you must file a claim by December 1, 2016. A claim form was included with the notice sent to you and specifies the amount you can receive.

NUCA, on behalf of its members, and three contractors – James D. Hinson Electrical Contracting Co., Blythe Development Co., and Callaway Grading, Inc. – sued AT&T in 2013, contending AT&T has for years improperly marked up the labor rates on its facility damage bills by roughly five to twelve percent with a hidden "claims processing" charge. The lawsuit also contends AT&T's charges for "loss of use" and "loss of service" that can add hundreds and in some cases thousands of dollars to many bills are improper.

As part of the settlement, AT&T will no longer include a claims processing charge for at least five years anywhere in the country. AT&T has also agreed for at least the next five years to stop charging for loss of use or loss of service in five states where courts have ruled similar charges are uncollectible – Arkansas, Florida, Georgia, Ohio, and Texas – and to change the way in which the charge is calculated in all other states. This change is expected to reduce the amount of the charge by more than 60 percent. Contractors can still continue to challenge even the reduced charge if it is added to their bills in the future.

NUCA thanks all who participated in the lawsuit for their work. The lawsuit and resulting settlement will benefit all NUCA members by putting some money in the pockets of those who have been overcharged, reducing the cost of future cable cuts involving AT&T, and sending a message that there may be consequences to other utilities that overreach.

On behalf of our national organization and our 26 state and local chapters, we are proud to advocate for our industry and serve as your association of choice.

POLITICAL INSIDERS

September 29, 2016

Political Insiders,

Late last night, both the House and Senate adjourned until after the election, but not before each passed budget measures to avert a government shutdown, and the House passed its version of WRDA.

Last evening, the House voted to include an amendment authorizing \$170 million in future appropriations for drinking water in Flint, MI. The House later passed the WRDA bill by a vote of 399-25.

This, and concessions on including Zika funding and emergency relief to Louisiana, allowed the Senate to move forward with a Continuing Resolution (CR) which will fund the government until early December. The bill passed the Senate 77-21 and later the House 342-85 clearing both chambers to recess until after the election.

The inclusion of Flint language in the House WRDA bill makes our position in the upcoming conference negotiation much stronger, because both bills now have extensive new funding for water infrastructure, and the House has very little leverage to push back against Senate demands.

Either way, that's a wrap on legislative activities until mid-late November. NUCA's GR activities will shift gears to the political, and supporting our friends election prospects.

If you aren't already receiving NUCA/PAC emails, I encourage you to fill out the attached authorization form and send it back to me. I also encourage you to look at the attached infographic if you have questions about what NUCA/PAC's objectives are. By law, we cannot communicate with you about NUCA/PAC activities without your authorization. You can authorize for up to 5 years, so sign it and forget about it! Joining NUCA/PAC does not obligate you to contribute and donations are expressly voluntary. Signing up is an additional education opportunity for the election implications of our priorities.

Also, I hope to see you in Denver for NUCA's Fall Leadership Conference. The GR Committee will have a significant planning session in preparation for the election and the next Congress that you will want to be a part of. <u>Visit the website for more information and to register</u>.


